Discussion Questions:

2. What has been your experience with small groups?
3. How should the Christian community be different from the community around us?
4. Read Ephesians 4:1-6.
 - a. How many times do you see the word “one”? Why was there an emphasis in these passages?
 - b. What does it mean to “live a life worthy of the calling”? Why does Paul use the word “prisoner” to give support to this phrase?
 - c. Notice in vs. 3 where unity comes from and who is tasked with keeping it!
5. How should our small group act as guardrails for our lives?
6. How should our small groups reflect Jesus into the world?
7. What do you think it means that we are the “body of Christ”?
8. Which of the three rules for the Christian community (be humble, gentle, and patient) is the hardest for you? Is there anything else you’d add to the list?
