



Discussion Questions:

1. Why do you think 'money and possessions' is a topic we don't want to hear from God about?
2. Did it surprise you to learn that Jesus talks more about money and possessions than faith and love combined? Why do you think this is the case?
3. Jesus says the greatest commandment is to love the Lord with all your heart. Jesus is talking about something more than just the organ in our chest. Rather, he's tapping into the rich idea that our heart is a reference to our entire self. How is loving God with all our hearts tied to our finances?
4. Is it possible to have a right and good relationship with God if aren't willing to trust him with our money and possessions?
5. Jesus says in Matthew 6 "Where our treasure is, there our hearts will be also." How has this been true for you?
6. What has been your experience with tithing? (good or bad.)
7. When was the last time you sat down and looked for more ways to be generous – or – to develop a 'larger heart of generosity.'
